4. Access all push notifications and alerts by selecting "Announcements."
5. Select "Survey" to participate in open surveys.
6. Access Xpress Bill Pay on the "Pay Utilities" tab.
7. Report issues by clicking on "Report an Issue."

Planning Charrettes Address Residents Concerns

The Town held two Planning Outreach Sessions in September to present the following:

- Population and estimated build out numbers for the Town
- Map of currently entitled projects
- Community input from the survey completed during the summer
- A financial overview of the Town's budget relative to property tax revenues
- A review of the POST Plan (parks, open space and trails)
- Opportunities for future neighborhood commercial zones

Moving forward, Town Staff will begin working with the Planning Commission and Town Council to identify and consider neighborhood commercial zoning for specific sites. Section 403.6 Address Markers

states: "All buildings shall have a permanently posted address, which shall be clearly visible from the driveway entrance at all times and be visible from both directions of travel along the road."
