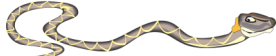

RATTLESNAKES!



Because Hideout is in a natural snake habitat, here are some words of advice and caution from www.wildawareutah.org:

Never try to poke, handle, corner or harass a snake.

Leave the snake alone; look but don't touch.

When hiking wear close-toed shoes and look where you place your feet and sit.

If you hear a rattle, don't move until you determine where the sound is coming from. Warn others.

If bitten, do **not** use a tourniquet, cold press, or suck out the venom. **Do** remain calm, loosen clothing around the wound, keep the wound below the level of the heart, and get medical attention immediately.

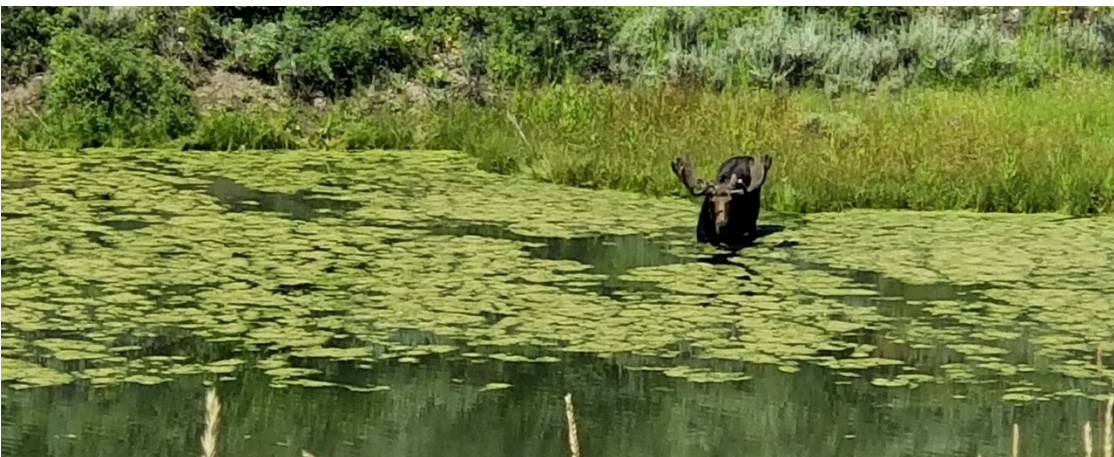
ROSS CREEK RECREATION AREA SOFT OPENING

CHECK UTAH WATERWAY CONDITIONS

The Utah Department of Environmental Quality/ Water Quality website alerts the public when serious algae blooms and potentially harmful conditions occur in waterways.
