UDOT Seeks Input on 2023 Long-Range Rural Transportation Plan

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) Long-Range Plan is now available for public comment. That means everyone!

The Plan details rural Utah's anticipated transportation needs for 2023 through 2050 and includes a list of proposed projects on State routes.

A key part of the planning process is involving the public. You are encouraged to comment on the plan through July 25, 2023.
