2023 Election Information

The 2023 General Election will be held on November 21, 2023.



All registered voters in Hideout were mailed a ballot, which must be postmarked no later than Monday, November 20, 2023 in order to be counted.

You may drop your ballot in the new drive-up ballot drop box located at Hideout Town Hall or any of the ballot drop box locations throughout Wasatch County. Please visit <https://hideoututah.gov/election-information/> for a list of drop box locations and hours.

You may vote in-person on Election Day (November 21) at the Wasatch County Administration Building. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m.—8:00 p.m.

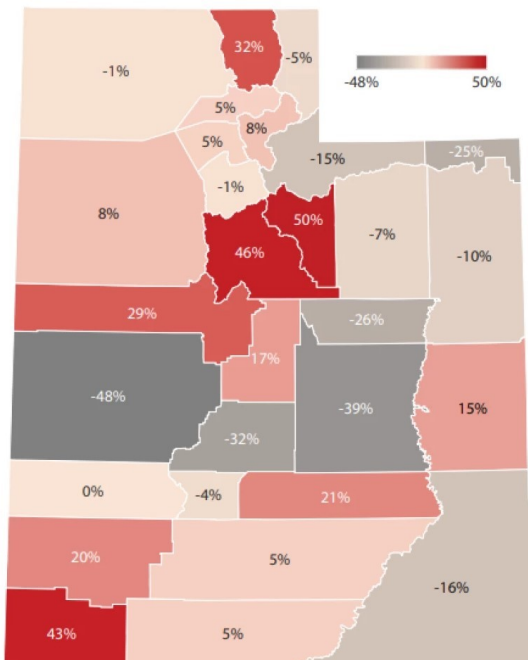
Wasatch County Schools Expect Fastest Growth in the State

From KCPW: While public school enrollment is falling across Utah, Wasatch County doesn't follow the trend.

A new report from the University of Utah's Gardner Policy Institute shows K-12 enrollment in the count is projected to grow by more than 4,000 students by 2060.

One reason is the explosion of growth in Heber Valley. The County is expected to double its population by 2060.

Figure 11: Percent Change in School-Age Population by County, 2020 to 2060

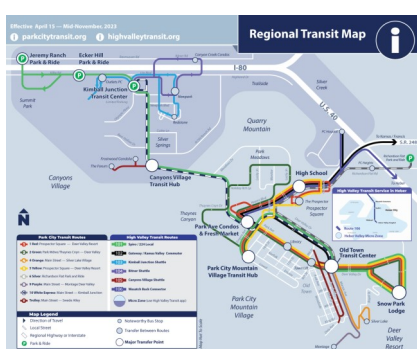


Note: School-age reflects population ages 5 to 17. Source: Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute State and County Projections 2020-2060

Park City Transit Routes and Schedules

Coming in mid-December:

There will be new direct bus routes from Richardson Flat to Deer Valley and Park City Resorts. There also will be a stop at the Old Town Transit Center. Still to be determined is the exact schedule, but buses will run from early morning through the evening.

Here is an easy homemade wassail that will fill the air with a welcoming Holiday aroma and warm your guests as they come in from the cold.

- 8 C Apple cider
- 4 Washed whole organic oranges
- 2 Washed whole organic Lemons
- 16 Cinnamon sticks
- Cloves
- 1/4 t Ground nutmeg



1. Poke whole cloves into 3 of the oranges and both lemons.
2. Reserve 8 cinnamon sticks and one orange as a garnish. Put all of the other ingredients into a large pot over medium low heat.
3. Bring to a simmer. Simmer for 30-45 minutes.
4. Ladle into mugs, garnishing each with a sliced orange and a cinnamon stick.
5. Enjoy!
