2. Incident stabilization. For example, put out the fire if possible, turn off water main, etc.
3. Remove yourself and others to a safe location.
4. If others are present, ask someone to call 911 as soon as possible.

Hello fellow Hideout residents,

September has arrived, bringing shorter days, cooler weather, autumn colors and the anticipation for winter sports. Labor Day often feels like the transition point between seasons, and for those who attended Miners Day, it kicked off with the "running of the balls." It's always a highlight for my grandson and his friends. As school begins again, please remember to drive carefully—school buses always have the right of way.

We're also excited to host a wonderful community event on **Friday, September 12** at the town's maintenance building area, just off Belaview Way near Ross Creek. There will be food trucks, live music, and plenty of opportunities to connect with neighbors — all at a great value. A special thanks to our Events Committee, including leaders like Jan De Feo and Kirk Benson, and the many volunteers whose hard work is making this possible.

Another important update: Hideout is working with Wasatch County officials to create an updated **Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP)**. I want to thank Jeremy Hales for generously sharing his expertise and helping us improve our preparedness. As highlighted at the Wildfire Risk Mitigation Symposium, knowing how to evacuate safely — including caring for pets — is essential for protecting our community during an emergency.

I am also working with Sheriff Jared Rigby and the council on improving contractor compliance. Too often, equipment and debris are left behind, creating safety hazards, and some contractors are parking in ways that invite accidents. I want to be clear: I value our builders, but I will enforce accountability when necessary to protect our town.

Finally, a reminder: every other Tuesday I hold an **open hour** for anyone who would like to meet one-on-one with me. These conversations have been enjoyable and, I hope, helpful for residents.

Thank you all for your continued support and engagement in making Hideout a stronger, safer, and more connected community.


